The conditions for an action to be correct – Condition 1

With regards to the conditions for an action to be correct, the Shaykh Muhammad ibn Saalih al 'Uthaymeen (زجنه الله)¹ states:

Firstly – that the action conform to the Sharee'ah in its basis. And that is such that the person does an act of worship whose basis has not been made a basis by Allaah, the Most High – for example, that he prays two rak'ahs whenever he enters his house and he takes this as a Sunnah - then this is rejected.

This is despite the foundation for the prayer being something legislated; however when he linked it (the prayer) with a basis that is not a legislated basis, it became something mardoodah (rejected).

Another example – if someone were to innovate an 'Eed to (celebrate) the victory of the Muslims at (the Battle of) Badr, then it would be rejected for him because attached it to a basis that Allaah and His Messenger did not appoint as a basis.
